



In 1979, the school moved from its first location at the Central Church of Christ to its present location, a beautiful and spacious 41.3-acre campus on Country Club Lane. The student population of more than 830 reflects the geographical, denominational, racial, and ethnic diversity of West Tennessee. We are deeply motivated in all facets by our faith in Jesus Christ. We are firmly committed to reflecting God's unconditional love for all people. Biblical principles serve as our ultimate guide as well as our goal. WE BELIEVE

- ...There is one God: The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, who subsist in unity, and also as three separate and distinct Persons (John 15:26; Ephesians 4:4-7).

- ...Baptism is by immersion for salvation, and is done in obedience to Jesus Christ's command in order to receive the Holy Spirit and the gift of salvation. The baptized believer is a new creation, freed from the bondage of sin, and added by God to His church (Romans 6:3-14; I Corinthians 5:17; Acts 2:47).

JACKSON

Jackson is a favorite for those who love both the bustling activity of a mid-size city and appreciate the qualities of a nearby rural environment. Located halfway between Memphis and Nashville, conveniently on Interstate 40, and in the heart of the Americana Music Triangle, Jackson is where country music connected to the blues, and the sound of Rock-A-Billy music was heard around the world.

COST OF LIVING

Affordability is one of the community's strengths. The median cost of available housing is below national and regional averages. Prospective homeowners may choose between new and established neighborhoods for homes within any price range. Factor in the low cost of living, and people may invest a greater percentage of their income into housing. Transfers often find their equity goes further in Jackson.



RETAIL

With more than two million square feet of retail space, Jackson has a variety of retail stores, from quaint local boutiques to national retailers ranking among the top 100 retail markets in the United States. The trade area consists of 13 West Tennessee counties with a population of around 400,000, allowing for many services and amenities not typically found in a community its size.

RECREATION

Jackson offers numerous sports for a host of adult and children's recreational leagues, golf courses, tennis courts, bowling centers, baseball, T-ball, softball, soccer, and other activities, including croquet and pickle ball courts! Hiking and cycling trails can be found along with many places to enjoy water recreation, such as kayaking and fishing. Middle Fork Bottoms, a new 850-acre natural area, includes paved walking trails, a 10-acre fishing lake, overlooks, boardwalks, and kayaking, among other activities. The West TN Healthcare Sportsplex features 17 baseball and softball fields, 2 dog parks, and 20 public parks covering 70 acres. Other recreational activities include BMX races, rodeos, horse shows, and historical reenactments.

ENTERTAINMENT & ARTS

From the Jackson Symphony to concerts at the AMP, from Jackson Theatre Guild community productions to Ballet Arts, Jackson celebrates the arts. The Jackson Arts Council connects and strengthens the arts in our community with over 50 non-profit arts organizations that make up the coalition. Jackson's public art installations are increasing the murals, sculptures, and other mediums throughout the community.
