Just because we're TINY doesn't mean we aren't MIGHTY!



JUDGES

Alex Sears — Music Ensemble

Alex Sears is entering his 12th year of teaching and his third year as the Rockvale High School Director of Bands in Murfreesboro, Tennessee. Prior to his appointment at Rockvale, he served as band director and taught marching bands at Siegel High School, Eagleville School and Marshall County High School. His ensembles regularly have achieved superior ratings at competitions and festivals, including multiple BO Regional Finalist appearances, a US Bands Regional Championship, and being named Reserve Grand Champion and Honorable Mention at the Contest of Champions at MTSU.

In addition to teaching, he is also an active composer and arranger of wind books for both marching band and indoor winds. Ensembles he has written for have been named finalists at the Tennessee Division 2 State Band Championships and have earned medals at the SCGC Winds Circuit Championships. He currently serves as a staff arranger for South Coast Music and Design.

A graduate of Tennessee Tech University in Cookeville, Mr. Sears received his undergraduate degree in instrumental music education. He spent two summers marching with the Esperanza Drum And Bugle Corps from San Diego, California, and won the 2006 Drum Corps International Individual and Ensemble gold medal for trombone.

Scott Steward — Music Effect

Scott Steward, a 2012 Dove Award winner who also recorded on a 2009 Grammy Nominated Recording Project, is a trumpet player who has made quite a mark as a musician in L.A. and Nashville. He has played lead trumpet for the FOX Reality Show “Next Great American Band” finalist Denver and The Mile

High Orchestra for many years, as well as worked on jobs with the Paul Cacia Jazz Orchestra, Louie Bellson, Bill Watrous, Natalie Grant, Casting Crowns, Jimmy Smith, Milt Bernhart, Pete Rugolo, Bobby Shew and many others. In 2013 he performed at Carnegie Hall as principal trumpet with the Manhattan Pops Orchestra, as well as an artist appearance with Denver and The Mile High Orchestra on the same night. In his youth, he performed as a soloist for The Blue Devils Drum and Bugle Corps and The Freelancers Drum and Bugle Corps.

As an educator, he has worked on staff for many reputable drum corps and high school programs, including The Spirit Of Atlanta, The Madison Scouts, The William Mason High School Band, The Franklin High School Band, The Siegel High School Band, The Etiwanda High School Band and for almost two decades, The McGavock High School Band.

Chris Lowry — Visual Ensemble

Chris Lowry is one of the band directors at Rockvale High School in Murfreesboro, Tennessee. He holds a Master of Music degree in Wind Band Conducting and a bachelor’s degree in Music Education from Middle Tennessee State University.

Mr. Lowry currently performs on the Titans Blue Crew Drum Line. He marched in the drum line of the Cavaliers Drum and Bugle Corps in 2014 and with Music City Mystique Percussion Ensemble in 2013 and 2015. He is an Innovative Percussion Artist.

Mr. Lowry is a member of the National Association for Music Education, Tennessee Music Education Association and is the webmaster for MTSBOA. He resides in Murfreesboro with his wife, Rebecca, and sons, James and Isaac.

J.R. Seals — Visual Effect

An active designer and adjudicator, J.R. Seals considers himself first and foremost a fan of the marching arts activity! His concepts have entertained, provoked and inspired generations. His engagement is rooted in a selfless desire to maximize each and every performance.

His contributions have produced numerous successes at the regional and national level. From 2001-2018, he led the creative development of Union City High School in Union City, Tennessee. During his tenure, the program earned 10 Bands of America Regional and Super Regional Class Championships. He owns JR Seals Concepts and is the founding editor of TennesseeMarching.com. He resides in Union City, Tennessee.

Adrian Baker — Percussion

Adrian Baker is a Middle Tennessee native, currently serving as Sycamore High School Assistant Principal in Pleasant View, Tennessee. Prior to being in education administration, he served as a band director for eight years in Middle Tennessee. Mr. Baker has directed and taught several award-winning ensembles, both middle and high school, public and private. In addition to teaching, he serves as composer/designer/arranger/consultant for several high school ensembles, as well as an international drum corps. His compositions and arrangements for marching band, jazz band, concert band, percussion ensemble and small ensembles have been featured at many concerts, festivals and competitions.

Cassie Bratcher — Color Guard

Cassie Bratcher has served in the world of marching arts for 20+ years as a performer, choreographer,

designer and program consultant. She has worked with programs from Tennessee to Kentucky, but spent the majority of her career as Milan High School Marching Band’s Color Guard Director. In 2017, she stepped down from that position to focus on her career in education and being a mom and wife. Since stepping down from the director spotlight, she has worked closely with many programs in a variety of ways — from developing storyboards to designing the perfect uniforms and flags to choreographing.

During her time with Milan (2006-2017), she designed uniforms, flags and props; choreographed all equipment and dance work; and assisted in visuals for wind players. Milan color guard was one of the top guards within its class at any and all contests attended and brought home 2nd place Division 2 guard multiple times. In 2016, she helped lead Milan Band to bring home a Division 2 bronze medal for the first time in 30+ years.

In addition to her color guard career, Cassie served as drum major for Milan. Post graduation, she went on to attend clinics to further her education in performing arts to better enhance her knowledge to assist in any and all areas of the marching arts. Furthermore, she has trained conductors, while assisting with developing conducting routines for drum majors throughout West Tennessee. More recently, she joined the Gulf Coast Judges Association. She has begun judging in the area of movement analysis within the winterguard circuit, and she continues to work closely with mentors as the evolution of the marching arts continues.

Many of her students have gone on to march with Austin Peay Color Guard, Phantom Regiment Drum and Bugle Corps, The Cavaliers Drum and Bugle Corps, Eklipse Independent Winterguard, Paramount Winterguard, and Pride of Cincinnati Winterguard.

EAGLE MARCHING BAND STAFF

Destiny Holt Hall — Head Band Director

Destiny Holt Hall is at the helm of the Jackson Christian Eagle Marching Band for the second year. During her tenure, the EMB has made finals at contests outside of state championships, swept their class on the first show of the season, and placed fourth overall in Division I State Marching Band Championships, which is the highest placement in school history.

She is a graduate of Bethel University, where she received her bachelor's degree in Music Education. Other notable accomplishments for Mrs. Holt include drum major for Music City Drum Corps in 2012, conductor for Phantom Regiment in 2014, Grammy Music Educator Nominee in 2017, WKRN's Educator of the Week 2017, and visual caption head for Arsenal Drum and Bugle Corps out of El Paso, Texas.

Anthony Hall — Music Coordinator

Mr. Hall is a graduate of McEwen High School and is in his second year as EMB Music Coordinator. During his time with Jackson Christian, he has helped lead the students to new heights. Not only does he provide full group instruction, he also offers private lessons for all brass instruments and master classes for the middle and high school levels.

In Mr. Hall's free time he plays trumpet with the Jackson Community Jazz Band and formerly played lead trumpet for Music City Swing. His other notable accomplishments include four seasons as a lead trumpet player for Music City Drum Corps, as well as being their soloist.

Andrew Pittman — Percussion Coordinator/ Sound Engineer

Formerly the synth player for Jackson Christian Eagle Marching Band, Andrew Pittman joined the EMB staff after graduating as valedictorian of his class. Mr. Pittman attends Union University, where he is a freshman, while he works with the EMB.

Notable accomplishments for Mr. Pittman include playing piano for 13 years, being an All-West Clarinetist and participating in many honor bands. His willingness to learn, adapt and help with electronics has rightfully earned his spot on the EMB staff.

Rachel Sykes — Color Guard Instructor

Rachel Sykes is a graduate of Gibson County High School, where she learned to lead color guards to new heights. Mrs. Sykes is in her third year with Eagle Marching Band, coming off an excellent season with "Alexander T. Wolf." Her guard placed second overall at the Tennessee Division I State Band Championships, and she continues leading and building the EMB color guard this year.

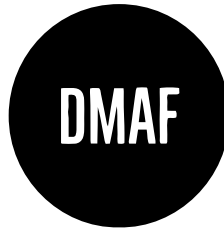
